## Fabric Candy Bowl Tutorial

Materials: For Large Bowl
2 Pieces of Fabric $12 \frac{1}{2}$ "x $12^{1 / 2 "}$
1 Piece of Batting $12 \frac{1}{2}$ "x $122^{1 / 2 "}$
For Small Bowl
2 Pieces of Fabric $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$
1 Piece of Batting $91 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x} 91^{1 / 2}$

1. Cut 2 pieces of fabric in one of the sizes above.
2. Layer fabric rights sides together and place batting on top.
3. Sew around all sides with $1 / 4$ " seam allowance, leaving a small opening on one side.

4. Turn right side out. Press.
5. Top stitch around edge closing opening.

Optional: If you want the bottom more square do the following.
For $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ bowl, stitch a $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square in the center to create a diamond shape.
For a square shape, turn the square on point and stitch a $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ square.
Doing the above will keep the fabric smooth when the bowl is turned.
You may also quilt the square if you desire.
6. Fold fabric pice in half. See Figure 1.

NOTE: Fabric folded on the INSIDE will be the OUTSIDE of finished bowl, and fabric folded on the OUTSIDE will be the INSIDE of the finished bowl with the points flipped down.
7. Along fold line, mark $1_{2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ in from each side. See Figure 2.

For $12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 12^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ bowl, measure down $2^{1 / 2}$ " from the fold and mark.

8. Connect the marks and sew on this line.
9. Refold fabric piece so that the 2 sewn edges are opposite each other just like you did in

10. Measure and refold these edges as you did in Figure 2.

NOTE: Sew from the FOLD UP, either $2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ or $2^{\prime \prime}$ depending on the size of the bowl you are making.
11. DO NOT trim the seams you have just sewn.

Turn bowl right side out and flip down the flaps. Hold flaps down with a bit of glue or sew on buttons.
